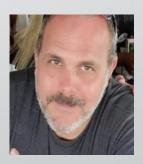

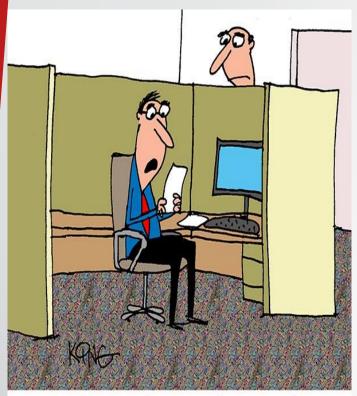

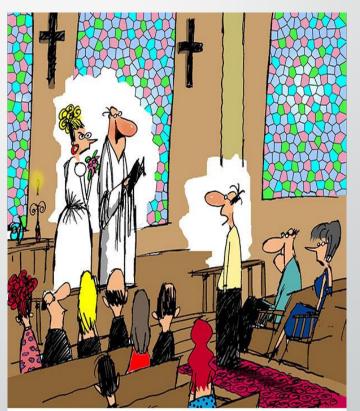

A Piece of History



Motor Trend's December 1953 Issue and the Corvette's Early Survival

The Chevrolet Corvette debuted as a concept car at the 1953 GM Motorama in January. Visitors responded with enthusiasm. Chevrolet decided to put the car into production. The first Corvettes rolled off a temporary assembly line in Flint, Michigan, in June 1953. Only 300 units appeared that year, each hand-built and priced at \$3,498.

Sales started slowly. By late summer, dealers reported customer hesitation. The car had a fabric top that leaked, no roll-up windows, and no exterior door handles. Its Powerglide automatic transmission and 150-horsepower Blue Flame six-cylinder engine did not match the performance many buyers expected from a sports car. Unsold 1953 models sat on dealer lots into the fall. Chevrolet executives began to question the future of the program. Production plans for 1954 called for 1,000 units per month, yet fewer than 200 cars had sold in the first six months. Some inside General Motors suggested canceling the Corvette before heavier losses occurred.

Motor Trend magazine published its December 1953 issue during this uncertain period. Inside, a multi-page road test written by technical editor Don MacDonald appeared. MacDonald drove a Corvette from Los Angeles to Yosemite and back. He praised the car's fiberglass body, low weight, and precise steering. He noted the independent suspension provided handling that European sports cars struggled to match on American roads. Acceleration times and cornering ability received detailed attention. MacDonald acknowledged the side curtains and lack of roll-up windows, yet he presented these as acceptable trade-offs for a pure sports car design.

The article included photographs of the Corvette on mountain roads and at high speeds. Comparison charts placed the Corvette against MG, Jaguar, and Triumph models. In most performance categories, the Chevrolet equaled or surpassed its imported rivals, often at a lower price.

Dealers later reported that customers brought copies of the Motor Trend issue into showrooms. Many buyers cited the article as a key reason for their purchase. Orders increased in early 1954. Chevrolet raised 1954 production from the original 1,000-unit plan to meet demand. The December 1953 Motor Trend coverage provided third-party validation at a moment when Chevrolet needed it most. Positive press from a respected automotive publication helped shift public perception. Buyers saw the Corvette as a credible competitor to established European brands.

Without the timing and tone of Motor Trend's December 1953 coverage, the Corvette story might have ended after a single model year. Instead, the magazine's endorsement gave Chevrolet the confidence and customer interest needed to continue production into 1954 and beyond. The Corvette enters its eighth decade because a magazine road test arrived when the car needed support most.

National Corvette Museum Announces 2026 Programming

New Exhibition: Driven To Preserve

Opening March 12, 2026, Driven to Preserve is rooted in the Museum's mission to collect, preserve, and share the legacy of America's Sports Car. The exhibition highlights the methods, decisions, and values that guide the Museum's stewardship of its collection. More than a dozen rarely seen Corvettes and interpretive displays will showcase how staff manage the movement of vehicles, catalog objects, and care for rare materials in a way that aligns with museum standards. Vehicles on view will include a 2003 Corvette Z06 Callaway, a 2006 Corvette Z06 Lingenfelter Twin Turbo, and a 2011 Corvette ZR1.

New Expanded Corvette Hall of Fame

The National Corvette Museum's expanded and reimagined Corvette Hall of Fame shines a brighter spotlight on the incredible individuals who have shaped the Corvette legacy. Anchored by the freshly preserved 1974 Stingray—the only Corvette owned by "Godfather of the Corvette" and Hall of Fame inductee Zora Arkus-Duntov—this revitalized space celebrates the passion, innovation, and contributions of Hall of Fame members in a way that captures their stories like never before.

New Collections Facility

A new 66,000-square-foot collections facility is under construction on the Museum campus. When completed in 2026, the building will provide dedicated space for long-term storage, vehicle preservation, and artifact conservation. Beginning in early 2027, the facility will also serve as an educational setting where visitors can take guided tours of the facility and witness firsthand how the Museum cares for its growing collection.

New Events and Adventures

The National Corvette Museum is set to make 2026 a landmark year with more than 20 sponsored events celebrating Corvette culture across the country and around the globe. Highlights include the return of the R8C Reunion (June 25–27), honoring the more than 20,000 Corvette owners who participated in the Museum's delivery program, and two of the Museum's signature gatherings: the Michelin National Corvette Museum Bash (April 23–25) and the Anniversary Celebration and Hall of Fame Induction (September 3–5). From the scenic routes of the Kentucky One Lap to Museum in Motion tours to Daytona International Speedway, 2026 promises unmatched experiences for Corvette enthusiasts worldwide.

November 2026: Military Appreciation Month

The National Corvette Museum will once again thank active duty, retired, and veteran military members for their service with free admission throughout November as part of our Military Appreciation Month celebration. 2026 will also welcome the return of Vets 'n Vettes to the NCM Motorsports Park. Since 2008, this event has united veterans, Corvette drivers, and patriots for an event that includes track time, scenic drives, and participation in the Bowling Green, KY, Veteran's Day Parade.

Educational Programming for the Next Generation

The McMichael Family Education Center provides hands-on exhibits and activities that support learning in automotive design and engineering. The Museum will offer expanded educational programs and new learning opportunities in 2026 to continue this work and reach new audiences.

Delivery Experience for All Generations

2025 was a banner year for Corvette and the National Corvette Museum Delivery programs. The popular R8C factory delivery option achieved a new milestone with 20,000 deliveries at the Museum, including the first eighth-generation ZR1s delivered through the R8C program.

For Corvette owners of any generation, the National Corvette Museum Delivery Experience provides the same VIP experience as an R8C Delivery: the once-in-a-lifetime opportunity to have your Corvette displayed inside the National Corvette Museum.

More Plant Tours Announced for 2026

Bowling Green Assembly Plant tours are returning for three weeks in February. This is a rare opportunity to be among the first visitors of 2026 to watch the eighth-generation Corvette being assembled. Availability is limited.

Photo Corner

Tech Tip of the Month

Modern Vettes are already weapons from the factory, but a few smart tech add-ons can make daily driving safer, road trips easier, and track days more insightful. We pulled in forum and Reddit chatter to keep this practical and owner-approved.

Smarter Visibility With a Dual Dash Cam



Corvettes attract attention—sometimes the wrong kind. Protecting your ride on the road and when parked should be high on your list. A <u>dual dash cam</u> is the simplest "set it and forget it" insurance you can add. Unlike single-lens cams, a dual setup records both the front and rear views at once, covering you for parking lot bumps, highway merges, or aggressive tailgaters.

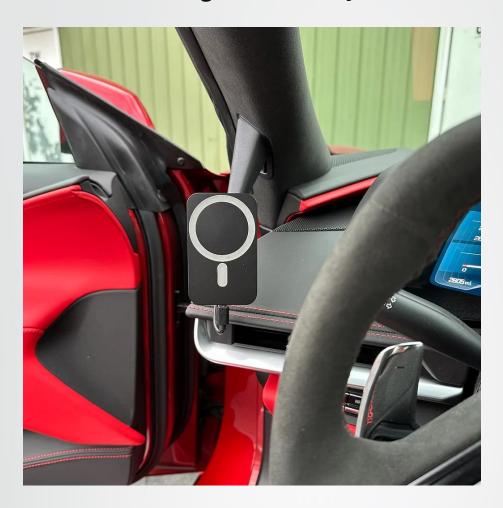
Corvette-specific tips

•In C5/C6 models, use a low-profile mount so you don't block the passenger's line of sight.

In C7/C8 models, route the rear cam cable along the passenger-side sill into the hatch for a stealthy, factory-like install.

Hardwire kits with voltage cutoffs are recommended if you want 24/7 harding mode without risking a dead battery.

Phone Power & Mounting That Actually Works in a Vette



Some C8 owners complain the factory wireless pad is awkward or inconsistent with larger phones and cases. Many simply revert to a wired plug for speed and reliability.

Corvette-specific tips

•C8 owners: if the factory pad annoys you, mount your phone higher (line-of-sight) and feed power from a PD adapter; several forum users report better results and less fumbling.

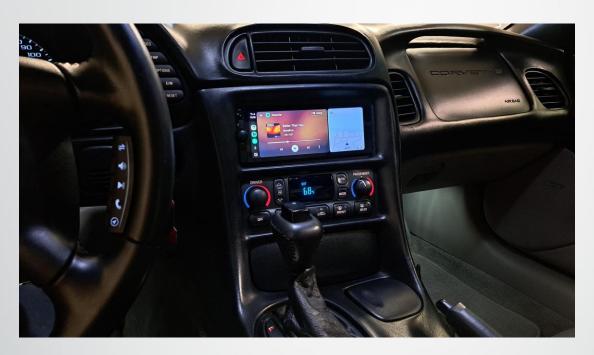
Heads-Up Display: Add One (or Augment It)



Did you know that the C5 Corvette already had a HUD? It was first offered as an option in 1998 and projected speed, RPM, oil pressure, among other vitals up onto the windscreen in front of the driver.

The C6 HUD wasn't standard on every trim (it came with 3LT), and many older models lack it entirely. If you want the "eyesup" experience without a full dash swap, OBD-II HUDs and compact gauge displays are the easy path.

Infotainment Upgrades for C5/C6 (CarPlay/AA Without the Pain)



If you're still rocking stock Bose in a C5/C6, a modern head unit transforms the car: wireless CarPlay/AA, backup camera input, and cleaner Bluetooth calling.

Install pointers

- •C5s typically need a double-DIN bezel/kit (Metra or custom), plus a data interface for chimes/retained power. CorvetteForum has detailed walkthroughs that de-mystify the trim and HVAC relocation.
- •For C6, camera routing is straightforward and there are many owner videos showing clean USB pass-throughs into the console.

Final Word

The right tech should disappear when you're driving—enhancing safety, cutting clutter, and surfacing the info you need without drama. Start with protection, then solve power and phone placement, then choose either HUD/gauges or infotainment depending on your generation. When you're ready to chase PBs, grab a data tool the community already trusts.

TREMEC Just Released a Manual 6-Speed Transmission with the Same Mounting Points of the C8's DCT



Despite all the features available on the <u>C8 Corvette</u>, there are some enthusiasts out there who just refuse to come to terms over the lack of a manual transmission. And who can blame them when there is nothing more fun than rowing through the gears of a manual Corvette?

Corvette engineers did look into equipping the midengine C8 Corvette with a manual gearbox, but as we've heard time and again, it simply came down to economics. By the time the C8 Corvette was in the process of development, GM was already sourcing an advanced dual-clutch automatic transmission from TREMEC and the costs and packaging requirements to do a separate manual transmission would simply make it too costly for the estimated 15% of buyers it would garner.

Here's what Executive Chief Engineer Tadge Juechter told <u>Motor Authority</u> just after the C8's reveal in July 2019:

"We couldn't find anybody honestly who'd be willing to do it.
Because just like the automatic, the DCT, it would have to be a bespoke manual," Tadge said. "It's low volume, very expensive. The reason is it's a low-volume industry. That industry is dying—building manual transmissions."

"Every year it goes down, down, down, down," he said.

The Dual Clutch Transmission for the C8 Corvette was developed with TREMEC and the units are built in Wixom, Michigan. That DCT was also a challenge according to Tadge because no one was making an off-the-shelf transaxle DCT with just the right dimensions. "We don't just find a DCT, an 8-speed DCT that plugs into this architecture with the right dimensions," he noted. Now that we are seven years into the C8 era, TREMEC is making news once again as they have just revealed a new transaxle 6-Speed Manual Transmission that offers the same packaging requirements, and more importantly, it uses the same mounting points of the C8. According to the official press release, "Gear shifts are controlled via cable that connects to the shift mechanism on the left side of the transaxle."

TREMEC says that by offering the new 6-speed manual in the same size and mounting points allows builders to use available factory Corvette components. The estimated ratings for it are 800 lb-ft of torque and 1,000 horsepower with engines capable of up to 8,600 RPM! Say, that's Z06 territory...are you thinking what I'm thinking?

Of course, one of the major problems with shoe-horning this new 6-speed manual into your C8 Corvette might come down to electronics as the Global B electrical systems in the Corvette all talk to each other, and the data generated is used in all aspects of the cars performance. Removing the transmission from that equation will most likely lead to many other issues.

Having said that, we've met a lot of smart, crafty people in the Corvette hobby over the years, and if there is any group of enthusiasts who can overcome these challenges of doing a manual C8 transmission swap, it's one of you guys. We're just waiting for that "hold my beer" moment because the people or company that can actually pull this off would have the gratitude of Corvette enthusiasts forever!

Could This Be The Design Of The C9 Corvette?

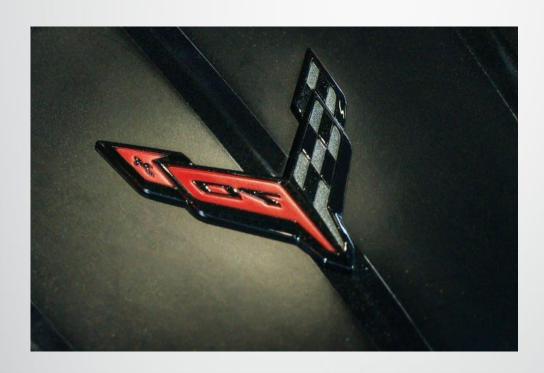


An image spotted at GM's "Tomorrow's Vision Today" design gallery reveals what could be an early styling concept for the next-generation C9 Corvette.

The photo was shared on social media and depicts a low-slung, wide-bodied supercar that carries an unmistakable Corvette flair, but with several radical new styling cues that push the brand's design language into new territory.

At first glance, we spot slim taillights, with an angular, horizontal layout that's stretched across a sculpted rear fascia. The fenders flare aggressively outward in dramatic fashion. Unlike several other recent GM concepts that appear to embrace all-electric propulsion, this particular design appears to retain a space for exhaust tips, giving us hope that it represents a gas-powered or hybrid model.

A central spine runs from the roofline down through the rear deck, while the lower half hints at a large rear diffuser. The rear glass taper and subtle flying-buttress design elements recall the current <u>C8</u>, but the proportions are even more extreme, with the body appearing lower, wider, and more race-focused than before. Notably, the car in the image appears to wear a crossed flags badge, which would confirm its connection to the Corvette nameplate. However, the lighting, surface treatment, and proportions mark a clear step forward.



Instead, GM's immediate focus when it comes to an electrified Vette lies with hybridized performance, as such as with the <u>Corvette ZR1X</u>. Nevertheless, if this design concept does indeed hint at the C9 Corvette, we can, at the very least, expect even more aggressive supercar styling and possibly some form of internal combustion.

GM Introduces the Stingray Protection Package for 2026 Corvette Stingrays

A recent Distribution Update on the <u>2026 Corvette</u> <u>Order Guide</u> turned us on to a new options package offered by Chevrolet for the <u>2026 Corvette Stingray</u>. Chevrolet has bundled several different options together to create the Stingray Protection Package which retails for \$1,195.

Here is what options are included and how much you can save by ordering them together as a package.

The Stingray Protection Package includes these three LPO Options:

- (VWE) Black honeycomb-design front radiator grille screens
- (STI) Black composite rocker extensions
- (VQK) Black front and rear splash guards

The Order Guide shows it available across all three of the Stingray's Trim Packages for both Coupe and Convertible models with these two exceptions:

- 1 Not available with (5V7) Black Ground Effects, LPO.
- 2 Not available with 5V7, 5VM, 5W8.

The PCU Stingray Protection Package retails for \$1,195 when ordered with your new 2026 Corvette and you can find it at the top of the Options tab on the <u>Build and Buy Configurator</u> under Packages. If you were to order these separately, the combined three options would retail for \$1,405. So you are saving \$210 by going with the package.

As Corvette buyers take the protection of their dream cars pretty seriously, this Stingray Protection Package should be under consideration for those who want that protection on Day 1 of ownership when you take delivery instead of relying on aftermarket parts once the car is received. Here's Why GM Removed The 2026 Corvette Coupe's Rear Window Defogger

The <u>2026 Corvette</u> debuts several important updates, including <u>a</u> <u>new cabin layout</u>, as well as the <u>launch of the new ZR1X hybrid</u>. In addition, the 2026 <u>Corvette</u> Coupe <u>no longer includes a rear window defogger</u>, as *GM Authority* reported earlier this month. As such, we reached out to General Motors for an explanation. Here's what The General had to say.

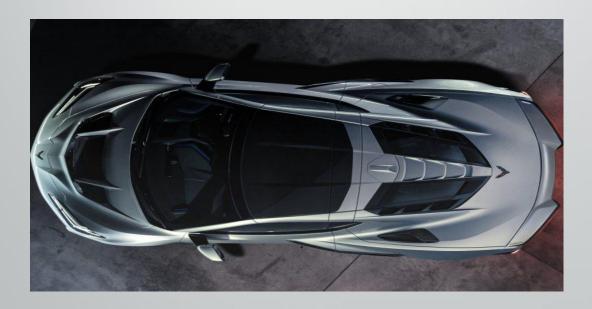


As expected, the reason GM deleted this feature comes down to redundancy:

"The rear defogger was removed for 2026 Corvette Coupe models. It was determined that the engine supplied enough heat to defog/defrost the rear glass on its own," General Motors told *GM Authority*.

As reported previously, the defogger button is still functional.

"The rear defogger button on the center console will turn on the heated side mirrors on Coupe models and will still turn on the functional rear glass defogger on Convertible models," General Motors confirmed.



In other words, the Corvette Coupe's mid-engine layout naturally provides sufficient heat to clear the rear glass without the need for a dedicated electric defogger grid. With the C8's V8 engine positioned just inches from the rear window, the airflow and radiant warmth generated by the engine bay can handle the job without breaking a sweat. Meanwhile, the 2026 Corvette Convertible retains a traditional rear defogger, given its retractable hardtop design.

Beyond changes to the rear defogger, the 2026 Corvette also ushers in an overhauled cabin space with new infotainment features. Every C8 variant now features a new 12.7-inch center touchscreen, a 14-inch driver information center, and an auxiliary 6.6-inch display, forming an immersive wraparound cockpit layout centered on the driver. Also notable is the launch of the new C8 ZR1X, which pairs the twin-turbocharged 5.5L V8 LT7 gasoline engine from the C8 ZR1 with a front-mounted electric motor similar to what powers the C8 E-Ray. The combination is good for more than 1,200 horsepower, with all-wheel grip to put it down. All C8 variants ride on the GMY2 platform, while vehicle production takes place exclusively at the GM Bowling Green Assembly Plant in Kentucky.

GM is Now Making New 2025 & 2026 Corvette Owners Confirm Fluid Change Intervals at Purchaselt looks like General Motors is dropping yet another Customer Acknowledgement Form for buyers of 2025 and 2026 Corvettes to sign off on before taking delivery.

Our friends at the MidEngineCorvetteForum.com recently shared this photo showing the new form for 2026 buyers which the customer will acknowledge the service intervals for the motor oil and transmission canister filters which are both covered under warranty.

It looks to be the same policy for the transmission canister filters which was <u>instituted with the 2024 model year</u> in which you need to schedule an appointment at a Chevrolet dealer within three years of ownership and when you are between 7,000-8,000 miles. The desired mileage is 7,500 but they give you 500 on either side. As we have stated, it has to be done at a Chevrolet dealer so that it's noted in the official service records. Failure to do so could lead to a denied warranty claim later on.

The covered Oil Change can be done within two years of ownership and it also includes tire rotation and a Multi-Point Vehicle Inspection.

The post on MECF says there is also a form for 2025 buyers and that dealers will retain a copy of the acknowledgement letter in the customer's deal jacket showing they signed off on it.

There is also a line on the document reminding the sales rep that customers also have to sign a Retention Acknowledgement Form if they are buying a 2026 Corvette ZR1 or ZR1X. That's the no-flip policy that hasn't really been all that effective as we've seen half a dozen ZR1s flipped already while dealers are holding private auctions and doing other shenanigans. Luckily, Chevrolet has ended the retention policies for the Z06 or E-Ray so one less form to sign at check-out for those buyers!
