


Upcoming Events





A Piece of History



New to the Collection: 1960 Corvette

General Motors produced over 10,000 Corvettes in 1960, but only 766 of them were Horizon Blue. This color was offered for just one year before being replaced by Jewel Blue in 1961.

The 1960 model year was also the last time the Corvette featured heavy grille teeth in the front and taillights that were inset into the rounded rear fenders. This car still has its original 283 cubic inch, 230 horsepower engine and a four-speed manual transmission.

The previous owner of this Corvette, Tim Zradicka, purchased the car around 2004. From 2009 to 2011, he completed a full, frame-off restoration. During this restoration, Zradicka discovered a gas station receipt from 1973 in a defroster duct, aiding his research into the Corvette's history and past owners. With the restoration complete, this car is a great example of Corvette's styling at the dawn of the 1960s.



Meet the 2029 Corvette Caravan Chairman: Jeffrey Duda



The Corvette Caravan is a nationwide, enthusiast-led road tour held every five years to coincide with the National Corvette Museum's anniversary celebration, uniting thousands of Corvette owners as they travel to Bowling Green, Kentucky, in honor of America's Sports Car.

Jeffrey Duda attended his first National Corvette Caravan in 2003 and has since played active roles in each Caravan, as Chairman, Co-Captain, and Captain.

For 2029, Jeff has been named the National Chairman for Corvette Caravan and will be working with Captains from across the country to coordinate the event. Jeff is a Lifetime Member of the National Corvette Museum and resides in Hainesport, NJ. He is an active member of The Original Garden State Corvette Club, and the original owner of a 2004 Le Mans Blue Commemorative Edition Zo6, and a 2019 Shadow Gray Coupe. Jeff is also known as the host of Zipity's Garage YouTube Channel, a Corvette-focused lifestyle channel.

New Collections Facility to Preserve Historic Corvette Cars and Artifacts

The National Corvette Museum announced a major expansion to protect and grow its renowned Corvette collection. The new 66,000-square-foot Collections facility, set to open in Fall 2026, will serve as the future home for some of the world's most important historic Corvettes, Corvette artifacts, and Corvette preservation efforts.

The new Collections facility will significantly increase the Museum's capacity for vehicle preservation, small artifact conservation, and long-term

From Sting Ray to Starship: The 1965 Star Trek Corvette Now on Display

At the intersection of American muscle and science fiction legend, one Corvette blurs the line between road and starship. Now on display at the National Corvette Museum, the 1965 Corvette featured in the 2009 reboot of Star Trek brings cinematic flair and Corvette heritage together in a way only America's Sports Car can.

This screen-used stunt car plays a pivotal role in the early moments of Star Trek (2009), as a young James T. Kirk sends it screaming across the Iowa countryside with a hover-bike cop in pursuit. The sequence is high-octane and pure adrenaline, ending with Kirk leaping out just before the Corvette launches into a quarry. While its fate in the film was dramatic, the actual car survives to tell its story.

As a 1965 model, this Corvette showcases mid-year updates including blacked-out horizontal grille bars, a reimagined fender design with three vertical louvers, and the introduction of four-wheel disc brakes—a performance milestone for the era. That same year also marked the return of Rochester fuel injection, making the '65 Corvette a benchmark in Sting Ray evolution.

A deleted scene from the film expands the narrative. The Corvette once belonged to George Kirk, James' late father. After George's death, the car ended up with James' uncle—until the future Starfleet captain found the keys and made the car his own, if only for one final ride. Now, thanks to a generous loan from Ray Zielinski, this iconic Corvette is part of the Museum's collection of historically significant vehicles. It's a reminder that Corvette's cultural impact doesn't stop at racetracks or road tours. It spans generations, genres, and galaxies.

The 1965 Star Trek Corvette is a must-see for fans of performance, pop culture, and everything in between. Visit the National Corvette Museum in Bowling Green, Kentucky, and stand face to face with a Corvette that boldly went where no car had gone before.



Why We're Expanding: Honoring Historic Vehicles Like Neil Armstrong's Corvette

A key reason behind the National Corvette Museum's expansion is the strategic growth of its vehicle collection, which requires the highest standards of preservation. One example is the recently donated 1967 Corvette Sting Ray once owned by astronaut Neil Armstrong.

Years before he walked on the Moon, Armstrong was commuting to NASA in a Marina Blue coupe powered by a 427-cubic-inch, 390-horsepower V8, highlighting one of the many ways that America's Sports Car has a direct connection to one of the most extraordinary chapters in American history. "This vehicle is a prime example of the need for a new facility," said Robert Maxhimer, Director of Curatorial Affairs and Education at the National Corvette Museum. "When a Corvette with a story like Neil Armstrong's comes through our doors, it deserves to be cared for in a space that is built to honor its legacy. This expansion ensures we can physically preserve the vehicle while protecting its history for future generations to enjoy and learn from."

The facility is being built to support the growth of the collection for decades to come, allowing the Museum to accept additional rare vehicles and historically significant materials that tell the full story of Corvette design, innovation, racing, and culture. It will also provide the Museum with additional exhibition space, enhancing storytelling and offering the behind-the-scenes experiences that Members and guests value.

The Future of Corvette Preservation Begins Now

As part of the drive to build the new collections facility, the National Corvette Museum has secured \$2.1 million in funding commitments to the capital campaign supporting this project.

Longtime supporters of the National Corvette Museum, Mary and Ivan Schrodt, have generously pledged \$1,000,000. In recognition of their gift, the Vehicle Collections Gallery will be named in their honor. Michael LaRocca, National Corvette Museum Board Chair-Elect, has pledged \$500,000 to name the Atrium Lobby the Michael LaRocca and Family Atrium, where all guided tours of the facility will begin. Melanie and Tim McMichael & Family, known philanthropists and longtime supporters of the Museum, have pledged \$500,000 to name the McMichael Family Preservation Center, as well as the Glenn and Andrea Johnson Heritage Conservation Lab.

This contribution builds on their previous investment in 2021 that supported the McMichael Family Education Center. An additional \$100,000 gift has also been secured from an anonymous donor.

A Campus-Wide Vision: Connecting Corvette History, Assembly, Manufacturing, and Ownership

The new Collections facility strengthens the National Corvette Museum's campus-wide approach to celebrating America's Sports Car. The Bowling Green Assembly Plant, where every Corvette has been built since 1981, is located just across the street. The NCM Motorsports Park, where guests can experience Corvette performance firsthand, is also part of the Museum campus and sits directly across

Interstate 65. Construction of the new Collections facility will also bring NCM Insurance one step closer to returning to the Museum campus. Once complete, this addition will allow visitors to engage with the full arc of Corvette ownership, history, and performance in a single location.

"This expansion project is about creating a sustainable future for preserving the full story of Corvette," said Bryce Burklow, President and CEO of the National Corvette Museum. "We're safeguarding the design breakthroughs, engineering milestones, and cultural moments that make Corvette an icon. And soon, our guests will be able to experience that process in a whole new way."

Tech Tip of the Month

Preparing Your Corvette for Winter Storage

🔅 1. Fluids & Engine Care

Change the oil and filter – used oil contains contaminants that can harm the engine during storage.

Top off all fluids:

Coolant/antifreeze (ensure proper mix for your climate)

Brake fluid

Power steering fluid (if applicable)

Transmission and differential fluid if due

Fuel system:

Fill the gas tank to 95–100% to reduce condensation.

Add **fuel stabilizer** (like Sta-Bil or Sea Foam), run engine for 5–10 minutes to circulate.

🔋 2. Battery & Electrical

Disconnect the battery (negative terminal) *or* use a **battery maintainer/trickle charger**.

Clean battery terminals before storage.

Check for any **aftermarket electronics** that could drain power and disconnect them.

3. Tires & Suspension

Inflate tires to the upper limit (usually +3-5 PSI).

Use tire cradles or foam pads if possible to prevent flat spots.

Don't engage the parking brake – use wheel chocks instead.

If long-term storage, consider putting the car on **jack stands** (but support suspension correctly to avoid stress).

📤 4. Storage Prep

Choose a clean, dry, temperature-stable location (garage preferred).

Use a breathable car cover (avoid plastic tarps – they trap moisture).

Plug exhaust pipes with steel wool or dryer sheets to keep out rodents.

Place **dryer sheets or mothballs** around interior/trunk to deter pests (avoid direct contact with surfaces).

Crack windows slightly to allow air circulation if in a secure area.

🔓 6. Safety & Misc

Check insurance – consider "storage coverage" or comprehensive-only to save money.

Update registration if your state allows seasonal storage.

Document condition with photos before storing (for insurance).

7. When Spring Returns

When you're ready to drive again:

Reconnect the battery.

Check tire pressure.

Remove fuel stabilizer by refilling with fresh fuel.

Check all fluids.

Start the engine and let it idle until warm.

Do a slow test drive and brake test before normal driving.

Corvette News

October Corvette Allocations Come In, But Nothing Yet for ZR1X

We have been reaching out to some of our dealer friends this morning asking about their <u>allocations</u> for the October Corvette order cycle. While we were hoping for some news on the upcoming <u>2026 Corvette ZR1X</u>, so far no dealers we have heard from received any ZR1X allocations at least for this round.

Chevy has been promising availability of the ZR1X by the end of 2025 which means ordering will have to be starting soon if they hope to meet that goal.

As for this allocation round, we are hearing all four Corvette models were available for allocations (though not every dealer got allocations for all four models). Some of the dealers we spoke with said they received "some" Stingrays, "a lot" of Zo6s and a couple dealers tell us they received multiple ZR1 allocations. Once again, it's the E-Ray that still appears be the most limited 2026 model this fall.

Next week, we'll get constraints and we are hoping to see with all these Zo6s going out that Chevrolet's supply of visible carbon fiber high wings and other aero parts continues to improve for buyers who want the Zo7 package. Last month's availability for Zo6 aero was okay, but it still needs to get better. We are also hoping to see more of the Electrochromic Roofs which was on 100% constraint in September.

For those that may want to forgo custom ordering of a new 2026, the Chevy Live Inventory Tracker is currently showing 3,294 new 2026 Corvettes that are at dealers or in transit, including 46 new 2026 ZR1s. Six of those cars are advertising an MSRP that is north of \$300K!

GM Cancels this Feature on C8 Corvette Coupes for 2026

Looks like our friend <u>Rick 'Corvette' Conti</u> may have found another change to the 2026 model year Corvettes that GM hasn't told anyone about yet, but then he asks if we ever really needed it in the first place?

It's a good question, and it looks like GM has finally answered: Nope!

The feature in question is the rear glass defroster on C8 Corvette Coupes. These are the micro-lines that run across the rear glass to defrost your rear window. Rick says that these two 2026 Corvettes shown in the video below from the NCM Motorsports Park no longer have them on their rear glass, which is nice as you get a clearer view of the engine bay.

Of course, a hot V8 running in the back basically accomplishes the same thing as the heat rises and melts off any ice or snow on the glass. The C8s are also equipped with the rearview mirror cameras so it's not like you need to defrost your rear window to see what's happening behind you. However, we did hear from one 2026 owner who says the rear defrost button is still on the row of HVAC buttons. But that's probably due to the feature still being used on the C8 Convertible's small vertical rear window. This reminds us of when Chevy removed the external hatch lock cylinder from behind the license plate. They determined it wasn't really necessary to provide for an emergency unlock for the rear hatch when the battery is up in the frunk.

Corvette E-Ray: Should GM Have Marketed The Hybrid Under A Different Name?

When it was officially <u>unveiled in January of 2023</u>, the <u>Corvette E-Ray</u> made headlines as the first-ever production-spec <u>Corvette</u> to roll out from the factory with a hybrid powertrain, combining the naturally aspirated <u>6.2L</u> <u>V8 LT2</u> gasoline engine with a front-mounted electric motor to provide some rather impressive straight-line acceleration, not to mention <u>a host of other benefits</u>. Nevertheless, we're hearing whispers that suggest the E-Ray may not be selling as well as GM had initially hoped. One possible reason? The name itself.

Outside of well-informed Corvette enthusiasts, many buyers likely hear the name "E-Ray" and assume it's a fully electric sports car. Of course, while readers on this website will likely be well aware that the Corvette E-Ray is in fact a hybrid and not a pure BEV, the E-Ray name may still unintentionally invite some confusion, especially at at a time when a good portion of the market is quick to slap an "E" on a nameplate when the propulsion system is powered exclusively by electrons. For shoppers unfamiliar with the car's actual powertrain setup, the E-Ray branding may be creating barriers before they even set foot in a showroom. From a performance standpoint, the Corvette E-Ray is certainly formidable. Pairing the same 6.2L V8 LT2 gasoline engine from the C8 Stingray with a single electric motor, the E-Ray's hybrid system delivers a combined 655 horsepower. What's more, the electric motor is used to drive the front axle exclusively, thus making the E-Ray the first production-spec all-wheeldrive Corvette in history.

The setup enables absolutely blistering acceleration, sending the Corvette E-Ray from a 0 to 60 mph in just 2.5 seconds, besting the ICE-only C8 Z06 by a tenth. The AWD setup also improves traction in less-than-ideal conditions, making the E-Ray potentially a year-round sports car. But the question remains: did GM make a misstep by calling it the Corvette E-Ray? Would something like "Stingray AWD" or "Stingray X" have been clearer? While there's plenty of equity in names like Stingray and Z06, "E-Ray" may be a bit ambiguous to the casual buyer, even potentially undermining the excitement in store.

Chevrolet Produced 51 New Corvette ZR1s Last Week, Now More ZR1s Than E-Rays in 2026

Last week we had mentioned that the Chevrolet Live Inventory Tracker was showing 67 new Corvette ZR1s that were "In Transit" from the factory to dealers for delivery. We've been watching the production numbers daily and as we said last week, we are really beginning to see a production breakout for the new King of Hill. For those waiting until the ADMs drop (additional dealer markups), your wait may be shorter than initially believed.

Thanks to Roger Kiel's C8 Production Tracker on Facebook, we've been watching the numbers of ZR1s completed with great interest. Last week, we counted 51 new ZR1s completed at the Corvette Assembly Plant during the five-day work week which is the highest weekly total we've seen to date. For the month, we are at 165 new ZR1s completed, and the total now stands at 248 ZR1s completed for the entire 2026 model year which just kicked off on July 30th.

I think that most enthusiasts would be happy to see 200 or so new Corvette ZR1s being built monthly, and at that rate we should be able to move through those dealer customer lists fairly quickly. That is also good news as I believe we'll see allocations for the upcoming ZR1X with the next order cycle in October, especially if GM wants to make their deadline for having the car available "at the end of 2025" as they stated during the reveal back in June.

And finally, we do have concerns over the dropping production numbers of the E-Ray, which last year accounted for approximately 12% of all Corvettes completed. With the ZR1 numbers continually moving upward, E-Ray production for 2026 is running only at a paltry 4% of total production. Based on the slower sales rates of the E-Ray and the fact that there are still 604 E-Rays from 2025 left over on dealer lots which represents approximately 20% of E-Rays produced during the 2025 model year, we really can't blame Chevrolet for shifting E-Ray production to the ZR1 if that is indeed what is happening. The ZR1 is the hot new model with customers paying full MSRP and then some, and so it's time for this model to shine...at least until the ZR1X starts production later this year.

General Motors Delivers 5,123 New Corvettes During 3rd Quarter 2025

General Motors released the third-quarter sales results today and it's not good news at all. Chevrolet sold just 5,123 new Corvettes during the quarter which is a 34.3% decline from the 7,797 Corvettes delivered during the same quarter a year ago. For the Calendar Year to date numbers, Chevrolet has delivered 17,718 new Corvettes from January 1st through September 30th, which is a decline of 31.1% CYTD over 2024. This is the second quarterly decline in sales for the 2025 after 2nd Quarter's sales numbers were down by 37.9% which was attributed to the plant being closed for four weeks for upgrades to the production line. We already expected to see less cars for the 3rd Quarter as total production has slowed to around 150 units per day, but then those sales numbers were further impacted by the STOP SALE Order issued on August 21st.

With the STOP SALE Order shutting down deliveries of the Zo6 and new ZR1s, dealers were simply unable to deliver these two models to its waiting customers due to the risk of fire from spilled fuel. New 2026 Corvettes are now getting the new spilled fuel diverter installed at the Assembly Plant, and remedied Corvette Zo6s and ZR1s can now be shipped and delivered to customers. However, dealers are still waiting for their own shipments of parts so they can remedy any of the remaining in-stock 2025s they have with the new diverter part.

During this time, Chevrolet is also struggling with sales of the 2025 E-Ray as roughly 20% of all 2025 E-Rays produced are still available at dealers. The only good news here is that many dealers are offering huge discounts off MSRP that can save you thousands. With the Zo6 sidelined for the last six weeks, we think Chevy missed an opportunity to offer another incentive for the performance hybrid sports car. Earlier this year, both the Stingray and the E-Ray were offered at up to \$3K off MSRP with a Costco Membership and those stackable incentives really helped to lower the price of entry. These delivery numbers are for U.S. sales only.


